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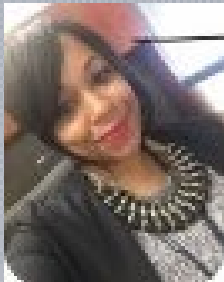

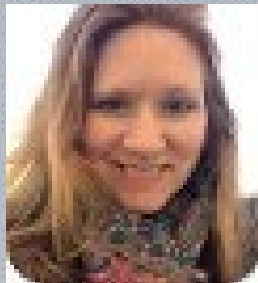


## ***Hello from the Local Aid Support Team !***
