
The following information was gleaned from Kathleen Jones's, Burleigh County Commissioner, information sharing session with the pilot Leadership class in November of 2018.

- 1. How to brief the county commissioners...
 - a. Be brief.
 - b. State the facts.
 - Be prepared for lots of questions from the county commissioners. They are trying to understand.
- 2. When to brief the county commissioners...
 - a. When you have a new situation
 - i. Keep them involved
 - ii. Keep them informed
- 3. How to handle county commissioner changes...
 - a. Contact county commissioner(s)
 - i. Introduce yourself
 - b. Ask for advice or thoughts
 - c. Invite them to travel on the road, in a blade, snowplow, etc.
 - i. Encourage a ride along
